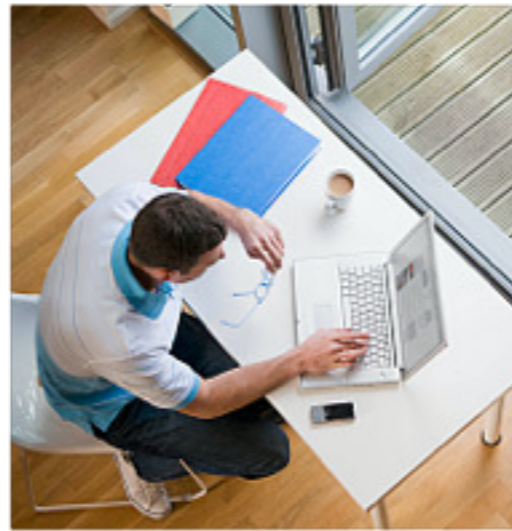

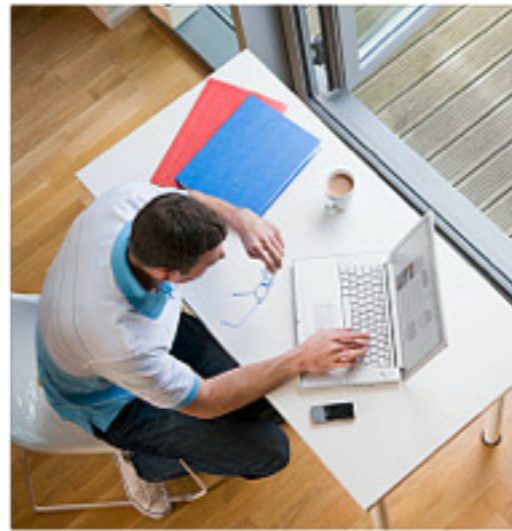

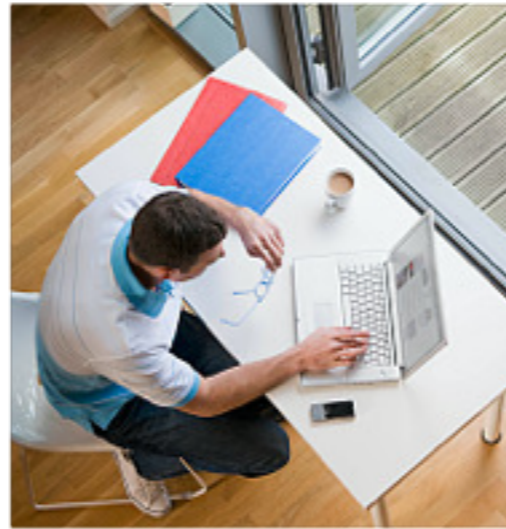

Disrupt the learning process!

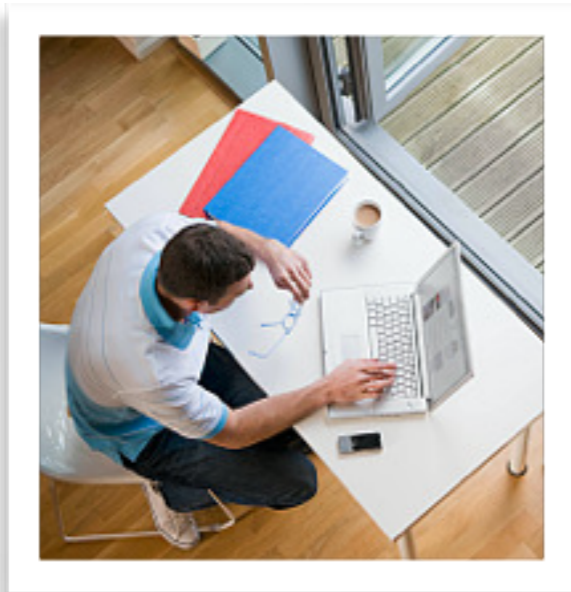
Yes, you read that correctly. Join the movement from one teacher for large groups of learners to thousands of teachers for each learner!

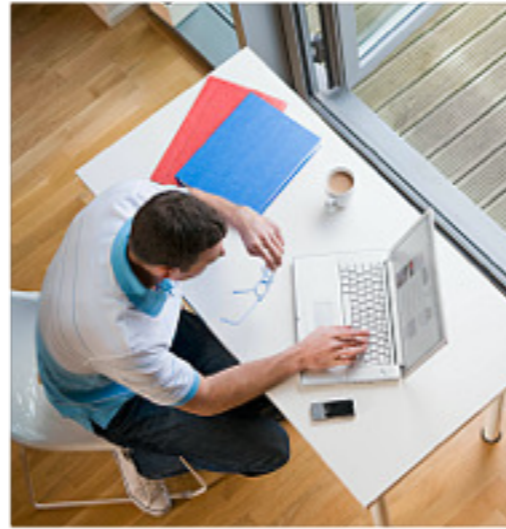
