
#### The LearningFRONT Hook Model for Virtual Professional Learning

Our hook is a virtual professional learning experience designed to connect a teacher's problem to LearningFRONT tools with enough frequency to form a habit of mind.


Our virtual professional learning hook applies four parts: 1. Trigger. 2. Action 3. Reward. 4. Investment.

## Internal Trigger: A problem that demands a teacher's attention!

"My students don't perform well on my classroom and state tests."

#### Action: Open TaskBuilder and plan a standards-based lesson!





- 1. Access content standards students are expected to learn
- 2. Select and edit evidenced-based templates for learning strategies and assessments
- 3. Design a plan for analyzing the results of the lesson for improvement

#### **Reward:** Give the teachers what they came for!



- 1. A draft standards-based lesson to improve student achievement in their classrooms
- 2. WikiTasks to share drafts with colleagues and coaches for improvement
- 3. Confidence that the final standards-based lesson will help students learn the standards

#### Investment: Increase the likelihood of teachers continuing the Hook!

Teaching the lesson, analyzing results, and making improvements "loads the next trigger" and "stores value" for when the lesson is posted as a benchmark and used with a new group of students.

#### External Trigger: Responding to increases in student achievement!

Data about student learning activate the Hook cycle with TaskBuilder for another lesson...


